"It is the hour to rend thy chains, the blossom time of souls."

The above line was written by Katharine Lee Bates, better known as the writer of the lyrics to "America the Beautiful." The daughter of a Congregationalist minister, she was both a graduate and a faculty member at Wellesley College, where she taught English literature.

This short line (which may be part of a longer poem—any help identifying it out there?) is a brief but beautiful way to describe Easter: the chains of death (both of Jesus' and ours) have been broken. A new future has been offered instead. And the "blossom time of souls" has begun—a time of growth, of new and abundant life.

Easter is a special time for celebration, for worship, for singing! It seems only appropriate to fall back on the great hymns of the faith to describe the great good news of Christ's resurrection. Here's the refrain from the hymn "Christ Arose (Low in the Grave He Lay)":

*Up from the grave He arose,
 With a mighty triumph o'er His foes,
 He arose a Victor from the dark domain,
 And He lives forever, with His saints to reign.
 He arose! He arose!
 Hallelujah! Christ arose!*

And finally, a poem by Katharine Tynan, entitled "Easter":

*Bring flowers to strew His way,
 Yea, sing, make holiday;
 Bid young lambs leap,
 And earth laugh after sleep.*

*For now He cometh forth
 Winter flies to the north,
 Folds wings and cries
 Amid the bergs and ice.*

*Yea, Death, great Death is dead,
 And Life reigns in his stead;*

**Worship****April 10****Fifth Sunday in Lent****Colossians 3:12-17; John 11:17-27****"The Resurrection and the Life"**

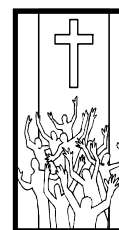

Standing there in the garden, weeping, Mary is encountered by someone she imagines to be the gardener. But she encountered her Lord instead!

Sunday, April 24

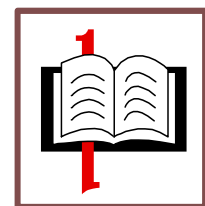
Easter Sunday, 8:00 and 9:30 a.m.

Wednesday Night Worship in Lent

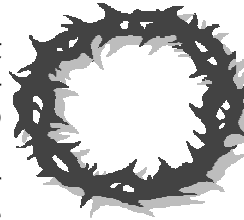
Join us for a time of fellowship and reflection on Wednesday evenings during Lent.

What is "Our Church's Wider Mission"?

Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) is the name of the financial support we provide for the work of the UCC at state, national, and international levels. It supports national and international missions, ecumenical relationships, advocacy, resources for congregations, and more. OCWM is supported through MCC's annual budget and through special offerings such as One Great Hour of Sharing, Neighbors in Need, Strengthen the Church, and the Christmas Fund.

One Great Hour of Sharing channels resources for international programs in health, education on agricultural development, emergency relief, refugee ministries and both international and domestic disaster response.

Strengthen the Church supports leadership for new and revitalizing

congregations, programs for youth and young adults, and leadership development for the whole church.

Neighbors in Need supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States, including the Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM), justice and advocacy, and direct service projects supported by Justice and Witness Ministries.

The Christmas Fund for the Veterans of the Cross and the Emergency Fund helps provide pension and health premium supplementation to low-income retired church workers, emergency assistance to clergy families in need, and Christmas checks to hundreds of annuitants, as administered by the Pension Boards.

She appreciates the warm welcome she has received from MCC members, staff and community associates.

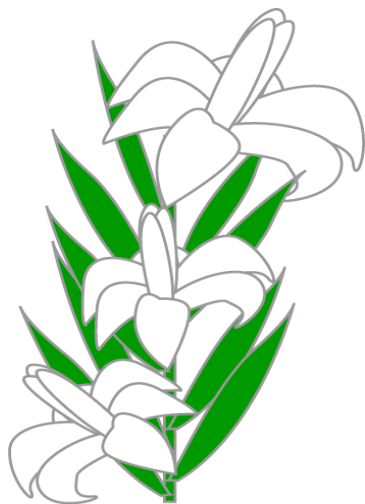

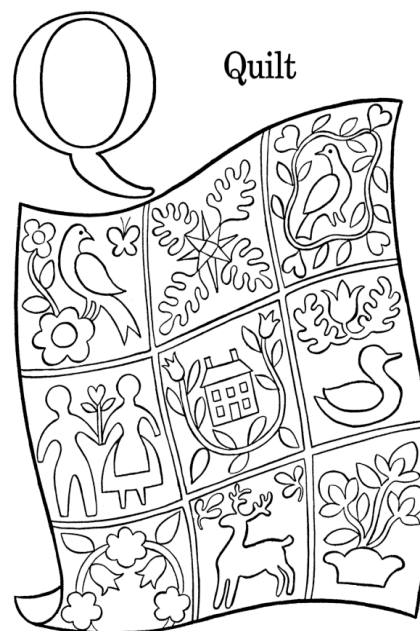
Our Quilt Celebration Continues!

There is a quilting myth that women put a mistake in each quilt because "only God is perfect...therefore it would be prideful to make a perfect quilt!" We don't know if any of our quilts have mistakes, but we do know that the "Grandmother's Flower Garden" antique fragile quilt on the quilt rack under the screen on the left side of the sanctuary was not made by the ladies of our church as reported last week, but rather made by Bill Richner's great great grandmother and is undoubtedly over 100 years old!

Speaking of grandmothers, the patchwork quilt on the third shutter on the left side of the sanctuary was made in the 1970's by Sue Hunt's mother for her granddaughter, Sue's daughter; Sue's mother lived on a farm and made this quilt from old feed sacks and other fabric scraps—Sue even recognizes pieces of fabric that were her pj's when she was 7 years old!

On the upper left 4th shutter is a t-shirt quilt made by Laura Crow's mother; these shirts definitely tell a story of the many activities Laura was involved in while in high school and is a treasured graduation gift from 1982.

Quilts like our congregation, can comfort us, remind us of events/deeds/people in the past, connect the past to us today and carry forward to the future.
