MCC Beloved,

New pastor, new traditions, right? I'm so excited to share a practice with you on January 8th that has been a sacred part of my journey for several years now.

I was first introduced to "Star Words" through a colleague and fellow member of Young Clergy Women International, a network of over 1600 young ordained clergywomen living and serving all over the world. The practice of Star Words has become a shared one among many of us - something we've taken to our congregations as a practice of intentional prayer and reflection. That said, in more recent years I've noticed several male colleagues have learned of and embraced Star Words as well - I'll admit, I just love the idea of a tradition born out of women's creativity shaping the sacred traditions of this generation's Christianity.

Star Words are a prayer practice whereby single words are written on small pieces of paper (often the shape of stars) and placed face down on a table or in a basket. During worship on Epiphany (this year we'll be celebrating on January 8th), you will be invited

to choose a card to take home with you. I like to tape the word to my refrigerator where I will see it daily. The word then serves as a guide and a touchpoint for reflection and prayer throughout the year.

Epiphany is the Christian holiday when we remember Wise Ones from the East being led by a star to find Jesus in Bethlehem. As the star guided them, we invite the words drawn in January to guide us in the year ahead.

Ironically enough, my Star Word in 2022 was "Journey", but I lost the physical star when we sold our house and moved not once but twice! Throughout the last year I've thought about the journey that brought me and my family from Platteville to Madison and our ministry together at Middleton Community Church. I never could have imagined from the start where we'd be now and I'm grateful for every faithful step.

When you receive your Star Word on January 8th I encourage you to spend some time with it. It might not be familiar at first - there's a chance it might not even be English. So begin by looking up a basic definition. Use it in a sentence or two. If it is familiar, attempt to reorient yourself to it. Look it up and see if anything surprises you. Then, find a place to hang it in your home or workplace where you will see it often. When you do, ask yourself these questions:

What does this word have to do with what is happening in my life and the world around me right now? And what might our Still-Speaking God be telling me through that connection?

I hope your words are a gift to you this year.

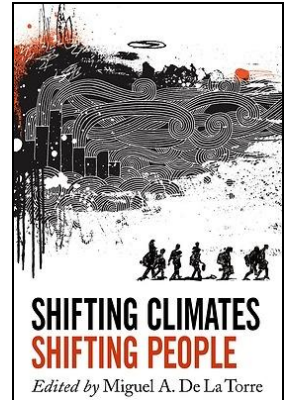
The choir will not be meeting on January 11.
