As we journey through this Lenten season, engaging our worship theme "Let Love Rise" I've decided now is the time to finally learn how to bake bread. I've never had the patience for baking, but I suspect Lent is as good a time as any to work on that.

Jesus invites his followers to lives filled with bread. He calls himself the "Bread of Life", feeds 5000 with only a few loaves, tells parables about yeast and wheat, breaks bread with sinners, and shares bread with his friends even as they betray and deny him.

Throughout this season, we too are invited to explore this metaphor and the role bread

plays in our society. From planting the seeds of wheat all the way to breaking and sharing bread around tables, how does Jesus, the Bread of Life, show up in our community? For me this all points to the table and the invitation Jesus offers again and again. We are called to the table of grace, forgiveness, and compassion - a table where there is more than enough food for all who hunger, more than enough love for all who gather.

As we come to the table this season I pray that together we Let Love Rise in our hearts, in our homes, in our church and in the world.

Lenten Worship Series: Let Love Rise



We remember that Jesus called himself "The Bread of Life," or that he said at the Last Supper, "This is my body broken for you." We have come to know those elements as part of our ritual life of faith. Bread is part of church. What is harder to understand is what that bread meant to Jesus and to the people of his time. What is the connection between the physical recipe of bread and the spiritual preparation of Lent? How is God harvesting, mixing, and rising in our lives? How are we preparing and sharing those blessings of God?

Bread goes on quite a journey- from a single grain planted and nurtured, through the transformation of dough raising, to the final breaking and sharing of bread at a table. In this Lenten series we travel that same journey with one truth: Jesus offers us himself as the bread of life. Every time we share the bread and cup together, we proclaim the risen Christ. Join the journey toward rising and sharing that bread this Lenten season! The first Sunday in Lent is February 26th.

Looking Forward: Holy Week and Easter Services

Words will abound on March 15 from 11:00 am-12:30 pm. A light snack, along with coffee, hot tea and hot chocolate will be served.


New this year! - Palm Sunday Singers

At this time, Just Bakery is scheduled to visit MCC on the second Sunday of




every other month, so upcoming 2023 dates currently include May 14 (Mother's Day) and July 9.

Why blue? This color represents awareness, peace, and solidarity. It is the color chosen to wear in support of anti-bullying. The founder of this campaign, Shira Blumenthal, was bullied as an elementary student. Since

Hats need to be made of 75% blue yarn. Hat circumference should be 16-20" to fit kids who are 5-18 years old. Pom-poms are optional. Any design is appreciated.

Hats for October 2023, Anti-bullying Month, need to be received by July 16. On display in Fellowship Hall are copies of Shira's story, knit and crochet patterns, and yarn that has been donated. A collection container for completed hats is also available. And, there is a basket on the table for any yarn donations.


Adult Games and Crafts



Middle School Balsams Winter Retreat Highlights

Camp Balsams - Accessibility Improvements

Camp Balsams is a resource that sets MCC apart from most other churches. Many church members and their extended families have used it as a place to reconnect with each other, with nature, and with God. (Reminder: Camp Balsams reservations for the summer are happening right now; see the next page for more information.)

One of the goals of the Balsams Committee is to keep the costs low enough that it should be able to be enjoyed by members in nearly any financial situation. (special funding is available if the cost is prohibitive due to one's financial situation; just ask.) For the past several years, cabin rental income and donations have allowed the camp to significantly reduce the principal balance of the Charlie's Cabin mortgage, cover maintenance costs, cover unexpected expenses like trees falling on roofs and burst pipes, and still get some additional work around the camp completed.

Continuing with the goal of making Camp Balsams available to all members, Charlie's Cabin was built around the idea of making the camp more accessible to people with mobility and allergen issues. While the cabin is not perfect from an accessibility standpoint, it does have an accessible shower and ramps to get in both the upstairs and downstairs, and an air conditioner to help control the allergens.

It also turns out that being in the woods on a hill leads to additional issues from a mobility standpoint. Exposed tree roots on our paths

were not only an issue for people in wheelchairs but also a tripping hazard to everyone else. During closina last year, boardwalk was built between the boat launch and the swimming pier. opening During this

spring, we plan to improve the exterior path from the main floor of Charlie's Cabin to the downstairs entrance and to the rest of camp.

As our camp approaches 100 years old, we have many challenges to improve our camp not only for those who have severe needs but also those for whom a little bit of accommodation would make all the difference -- like someone with a bad knee.

We are starting with an item that we believe will be a joy to nearly all campers: we are looking to double the size of the swimming pier! Visualize it as mirroring the current pier to change the shape from an L to a T, though with just the one existing set of stairs going into the water. (see artist rendering below) This will allow for more people to enjoy the end of the pier, allow for easier passing on the pier when two groups are heading opposite ways, and to make it easier for those who may need another person to assist them with balancing.



This pier expansion comes to just over \$8500, and we all know what's coming next... we're asking people if they are willing to donate towards the pier expansion and toward future accessibility improvements to the camp. A designated gift fund earmarked for such projects will help us to determine the scope and schedule of what projects we can plan for.

Camp Balsams: Our Lakeside Retreat Online Summer Reservation Procedures for 2023

Camp Balsams is a personal, family and group retreat, owned by Middleton Community Church, United Church of Christ. Located on the shore of Bass Lake, five miles east of Eagle River, Wisconsin, it is perfect for active family fun: fishing, swimming, or hiking. Camp Balsams is also perfect for quiet spiritual retreat, cooking s'mores, singing songs, counting stars, and sharing faith around the fire.

We own five cabins rentable by MCC members for the summer season, this year from May 23 through October 5. One of those, Charlie's Cabin, is rentable year-round.

Cabin rental rates were raised for the first time since 2015 to help ensure our future financial viability. Beginning with the summer season, the weekly rates are as follows: Cabin 2-\$245; Cabin 3-\$420; Cabin 4-\$385; Cabin 5-\$490; Charlie's Cabin-\$805. No deposit is required.

It is the intention of the Camp Balsams Committee that the camp be accessible to all members. If the rates present a hardship, please contact <u>Pastor Zayna</u> or one of the camp co-chairs, <u>Ross Michaels</u> or <u>Joe Tennies</u>.


